Executive Summary

1,190 students, advisers and guests participated at the FCCLA State Conference held at the Denver Tech Marriott, April 3 – 5, 2014 and the Food Events Conference was held April 11, 2014 at Johnson & Wales University. The conference theme was "Camp Expedition Inspiration". The total cost of the conference was \$123,004.17 and the total revenue for the conference was \$109,142.53. 888 Students from across Colorado competed in 39 STAR and State competitive events with 146 of national qualifiers from 30 schools. Colorado FCCLA gave out 20 state awards and 2 scholarships to members, advisers, administrators, Friends of FCCLA, legislators, and chapters. 10 state officers were recognized for the contributions and 13 members were elected and installed as state officers for the 2014 – 2015 year. The conference used 21 FCCLA staff members and volunteers, 74 event chair people, 254 judges, and sessions and competitive events.

Financial Summary

Overview

Colorado FCCLA used vendor payments, conference fees and affiliation monies to fund the 2014 State Leadership Conference. The majority of the conference was funded through conference fees while most of conference staff expenses of mileage and per diem were funded through affiliation monies. The Colorado FCCLA Executive Council reviews the state conference budget and will make recommendations for future conferences.
