Any current FCCLA chapter adviser with 5 or more years of experience. Previous winners will be considered after 5 years. Their work during that five-year period can be submitted for evidence. All other applicants may use ALL past experience when completing this form

Who may submit this application: Adviser, advisory board member, students, parents, administrator, State Executive Council Member, or any other person knowledgeable about advisers work.

- To connect FCCLA and its membership to groups outside the traditional classroom environment.

- B. Resources developed to help teachers and prospective teachers make STAR Events an integral part of Family and Consumer Sciences education (e.g. workshops, lesson plans, etc.). (25 points)
- C. Impact of volunteer activities on FCCLA and STAR Events overall. (25 points)
- D. Reflection of the FCCLA mission and philosophy of STAR Events in personal life. (10 points)
