CAREER EXPLORATION THROUGH FCCLA

FCCLA made a concentrated effort to illustrate the connection of FCCLA and Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS) to career pathways and hosted a focus group to assist us in this process. A survey of business and industry stakeholders found that FCCLA most directly supports career pathways in the hospitality and tourism, visual arts and design, education and training, and human services careers.

FCCLA National Programs and Competitive Events support CTE students' development of knowledge and skills, enhancing the classroom experience and career pathway initiatives. FCCLA is integrated into FACS and is intracurricular, exposing students to work-based learning, business and industry networks, and industry-recognized certifications. FCCLA members explore career opportunities and build their real world skills by developing projects, engaging and participating in events, and competing regionally and nationally for scholarships and awards.



HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM

The management, marketing, and operations of restaurants and other food services, lodging, attractions, recreation events, and travel-related services.

Possible careers include:

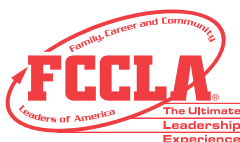

Individual events evaluate one member's performance.

Team events evaluate several participant's or a chapter's performance as one entry.

Team events may be composed of 1-3 individuals; exempt Parliamentary Procedure (4-8 members) and Front of the House (1-2 members).

Two entries may be any of the following: 2 teams of 1-3 individuals, 2 individuals, or 1 team and 1 individual.

An event category is determined by the participant's current or previous enrollment in Family and Consumer Sciences coursework or a Career Cluster class/course that is taught or could be taught by a person approved by the state education system for teaching Family and Consumer Sciences courses or content areas and are nationally affiliated members of Family, Career and Community Leaders of America and participant's grade in school during the school year preceding the State Leadership Conference. Any change in membership status must be reported by the February 15 deadline.

Event categories are defined as:

- **Junior**—FCCLA chapter members grade 6-9.
- **Senior**—FCCLA chapter members in grades 10-12; who are identified as comprehensive members on the national affiliation form.
- **Occupational**—FCCLA chapter members in grades 10–12; who have been or are currently enrolled in occupational Family and Consumer Sciences coursework; and who are identified as occupational on the national affiliation form.
- A team composed of both junior, senior, and occupational members must enter the senior category.
- A team composed of both senior and occupational members must enter the senior category.
- A team composed of both junior and occupational members must enter the senior category.
- Team events with only senior occupational categories may not include junior members.
